COOKIE POLICY

1. BACKGROUND

1.1 Purpose of the Cookie Policy

This Cookie Policy describes the different categories of cookies and similar technologies that may be applied via the Service.

1.2 Incorporation Into Other Agreements

This Cookie Policy is incorporated into and forms part of the:

- (a) Terms and Conditions;
 - (b) Customer Agreement;
 - (c) Loserpool/Razorpool Rulebook; and
 - (d) Privacy Policy,
- as the context so requires.

1.3 Definitions

Unless otherwise defined herein, capitalized words and phrases that are used in this Cookie Policy shall have the meanings given to those words and phrases in their respective agreements.

1.4 Acceptance of Cookies

By using the Service, you are agreeing to the use of cookies.

1.5 Changes to Cookie Policy

1.5.1 We may change this Cookie Policy at any time. Please take a look at the "LAST REVISED" legend at the top of this page to see when this Cookie Policy was last revised.

1.5.2 Any changes in this Cookie Policy will become effective when we make the revised Cookie Policy available on or through the Service.

2. COOKIES

2.1 What is a Cookie

- 2.1.1 Cookies are a standard feature of websites that allow us to store small amounts of data on your computer or mobile device about your use of our Service. Cookies may be used to enable the functionality provided by our Service, and may be used for analytic and advertising purposes as described below.
- 2.1.2 Cookies can be used to do a number of things, like recognize you when you use our Service, remember your preferences, and give you a personalized experience that is in line with your settings. Cookies also make your interactions with us more secure and faster. Additionally, cookies allow us to bring you advertising both on and off our Service, and bring customized features to you.
- 2.1.3 You may choose whether to accept cookies by changing the settings on your browser or choosing the opt out provided below. However, if you disable cookies, your experience using our Service may be diminished and some features may not work as intended.

2.2 What Cookies do we Use

- 2.2.1 Below we list the different categories of cookies that may be used on the Service. To the extent any Personal Information is collected through cookies, the Privacy Policy applies to and complements this Cookie Policy:
 - (a) **Essential Cookies.** Essential cookies enable you to navigate our Service and to use its services and features. Without these cookies, the Service will not perform as smoothly for you as we would like it to and we may not be able to provide certain services or features.
 - (b) **Preference Cookies.** Preference cookies collect information about your choices and preferences, and allow us to remember language or other local settings and customize your usage of the Service accordingly.
 - (c) **Social Media Cookies.** Social media cookies collect information about your social media usage. These cookies may be stored and accessed by us and/or third party websites that provide social media services, such as Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, or Google+.
 - (d) **Analytic Cookies.** We may use analytic cookies to collect information about your use of the Service and enable us to improve the way the Service works. We may set these cookies or they may be set by

companies that help us with analytic. For example, analytic cookies show us which are the most frequently visited pages, help us record any difficulties you have with the Service, and show us whether our advertising is effective or not. This allows us to see the overall patterns of usage via the Service, rather than the usage of a single person. We use the information to analyse traffic, but we do not examine this information for individually identifying information.

- (e) **Advertising Cookies.** Advertising cookies are set to display targeted promotions or advertisements based upon your interests, or to manage our advertising. These cookies collect information about your activities on the Service and other websites to provide you targeted advertising. These cookies may be stored and accessed by us and/or any of our advertising partners.
- (f) **Flash Cookies.** Flash Cookies, also known as Local Shared Objects or “LSOs”, are used to store your preferences or display content based upon what you view through the Service and to personalize your visit. Flash Cookies are different from standard browser cookies because of the amount and type of data, and how data are stored. Cookie management tools provided by your browser will not remove Flash Cookies. 2.3 Who Puts Cookies on my Device/Browser?

- 2.3.1 Cookies may be placed on your device by us as the Service operator. These cookies are called “first party” Cookies. Some cookies may however be placed on your device by a party other than us. These cookies are called “third party” cookies. Therefore some cookies that have been set on our Service are not related to us.
- 2.3.2 When you visit a page with content embedded from another service provided, these service providers may set their own cookies on your web browser. They remember that you have visited a website; this information is shared with other organizations such as advertisers. Often targeting or advertising cookies will be linked to site functionality provided by the other organization.

2.3.3 We do not control the use of third party cookies and cannot access them due to the way that cookies work, as cookies can only be accessed by the party who originally set them. You should check the third party websites for more information about these cookies.

3. MANAGING COOKIES

3.1 General

Many browsers give you the ability to manage cookies to suit you by changing your browser settings. For example, some browsers will allow you to set up rules to manage cookies on a site-by-site basis, which gives you the ability to disallow cookies from websites that you do not trust. 3.2 Disabling Cookies

3.2.1 Please note that many features of our Service require the use of cookies to function properly. By disabling cookies you may be unable to use certain functionality and/or access certain content through our Service.

3.2.2 Please further note that it is necessary to store a single "opt out" cookie for the Service in order to store your "opt out" preference. The opt out cookie is an essential cookie. If you block or delete the opt out cookie(s), the opt out functionality will not work.

3.3 Adjusting Settings to Deal with Cookies

3.3.1 You can also adjust the settings on your browser or mobile device to refuse or accept cookies. Information about the procedure to follow in order to enable or disable cookies can be found on your internet browser provider's website via your help screen or in your mobile device's settings. As noted above, some features and content through our Service will become unavailable and/or not work properly if you disable cookies.
